Meeting was called to order

Terry welcomed everyone and thanked them for attending. Appreciation was extended to Jeff Beane for hosing the meeting at the Museum's Research Facility.

Updates from other working groups

- PR & T (Kendrick Weeks reporting)
 - Met January 24, 2008. Article 55 being rewritten (potentially dangerous animals). Just about ready to send to steering committee. Also talked about turtle laws and Asian turtle market (trying to document this more in North Carolina). There is a resolution on the NCPARC website related to snapping, mud and musk turtle harvest collection limits. Jeff Hall sent an email to all NCPARC members with a link to make comments on this resolution. Continue to share this info with others and encourage them to make comments as well (till Feb. 1st).
- RIMM (Grover Barfield reporting)
 - Met January 16' 2008 at UNCG. Looked at herp road crossing data. Possible April 3rd training related to Box turtle project (conducted at Haw River State Park). A presentation on chytrid fungus was given. Working on recommendations to wildlife commission regarding developers. Talked about data sharing throughout the state (heritage foundation, etc).
- NCPARC Steering committee (Jeff Hall reporting)
 - Going to try to get info on the website related to who is serving on this committee.
 Currently 11 members on this committee. Representative from museum, herp society, universities, chairs of working groups, representative of wildlife commission, and representative from non-profits. Working groups bring matters to the steering committee for a vote.

Current Initiatives

- 1. Annual NCPARC Meeting, March 6-7, Trinity Center, Salter Path, NC
 - A draft agenda was presented for this committee to comment on. Hopefully, registration info will be on the NCPARC website in the next couple of days.
 - There are some major changes from last year's meeting -fewer workshops, 2 concurrent sessions on Thursday, being called task force teams, on friday there will be one field workshop session with several options for field opportunities.
 - Jeff Holmes (Nashville) -keynote speaker
 - Task force Team and Field workshop ideas on handout provided (see attached)
 - Theme-Habitats for herps and humanity-Threats to conservation of imperiled species
 - Need topics for table conversations at Thursday evening dinner
 - Table to elect speaker for group, given opportunity to discuss with entire group by using post-it papers to highlight main ideas. Topic ideas:

2. Habitat Management Guidelines [www.parcplace.org, \$10]

- Talked to NC STATE Forestry Education Outreach program about workshop for this. There appear to be more hurdles than originally anticipated to this process. Jeff Hall still working out the logistics of being able to do this. Maybe in the sandhills area, somewhere in Sanford, NC. The workshop should be held some place where we could reach multiple types of habitat. Target audience land managers: US forest service, park managers, NC division of forest resources, US forest service, land trust, nature conservancy, etc.. Had hoped for May but probably not going to happen, probably more like September.

3. Wildlife species profiles

Updating of wildlife species profiles is almost completed. Some have already been posted. There has been lot's of hard work on this. Almost all have come back, some need to still be reviewed. If you still have one and have not done it, try to complete it when you can and send on to Jeff Hall. Begin to think about what future species profiles we might want to develop. If anyone has a 'pet' herp and would like to develop a new profile just let Jeff Hall know. Jeff is working with Kay Cross, conservation education group. Does not appear that range maps will be updated. Kimberly Burge will follow up on this.

Kristin will do this and send to me so that I can forward to mike to post on the website. Some discussion regarding ways to make this list in a format that would allow for queries? Can it be created in ACCESS and posted so that one could download in ACCESS to own computer?

Jeff Marcus, Piedmont Wildlife Diversity Supervisor (email). Hinson Lake, snakes killed by public, wants to erect a sign discouraging killing of snakes, asking if we have some sort of appropriate materials already put together that could be modified for Hinson Lake? Are there legal restrictions on killing a non-listed species? Town park. Not game land. PRETTY GOOD NEED FOR THIS. MAYBE THIS SIGN SHOULD TAKE MULTIPLE FORMS DEPENDING ON THE TYPE OF LAND. SEEMS LIKE GREATEST PROBLEM WITH WATER SNAKES. TALKING TO PEOPLE MIGHT WORK BETTER THAN ANY SIGN BECAUSE YOU CAN FIND OUT WHY THEY ARE KILLING SNAKE. SITE SPECIFIC SIGN IDENTIFYING SPECIFIC SNAKE AND FACT THAT IT IS NON-VENEMOUS. WORK WITH EAGLE SCOUT TO BUILD A STRUCTURE TO TEACH ABOUT SNAKES. IS THERE A PRODUCT THAT WE HAVE THAT COULD BE USED MORE GENERALLY? SIGNAGE CONTEST WITH LOCAL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL. RICHMOND COUNTY. JEFF HALL GOING TO GET WITH JEFF MARCUS, MAYBE TO DO A PROGRAM AT THE SCHOOL AND FOLLOW UP WITH CONTEST. GROVER BARFIELD IS WILLING TO BRING SNAKES TO PROGRAM. COMMUNITY PROGRAM. TERRY TOMASEK WILL ALSO HELP.
